Animal idioms about Dogs

Instructions:

- 1. An **idiom** is a phrase or expression whose meaning can't be understood from the ordinary meanings of the words in it.
- 2. Tell the participants you will giving them various idioms related to dogs.
- 3. Provide the idiom.
- 4. Have the participants give the meaning of the idiom.
- 5. As always, ask questions to facilitate discussions
- 6. Progression: Say the first part of the phrase and have the participants complete the idiom.
- 7. Progression: Replace the word(s) in bold by saying the word "blank" and have the participants complete the last part of the phrase.
- "as clean as a hound's tooth"- very clean
- "*as crooked* as a dog's <u>hind leg</u>"- dishonest
- "as sick as a dog"- being very ill
- "one's bark is worse than one's bite"- when one's actions don't follow their words
- "*to bark* up <u>the wrong tree</u>"- to choose the wrong course of action or to ask the wrong person
- "*better* to be a live dog than <u>a dead lion</u>"- it is better to be a live coward than a dead hero (this is from Ecclesiastes in the Bible)
- "call the dogs <u>off</u> or call off the <u>dogs</u>"- to stop threatening, chasing or hounding someone
- "*dog* and pony <u>show</u>"- something that you disapprove of because you think that it has only been organized to impress you
- "dog-eat-dog"- ready or willing to fight and hurt others to get what one wants
- "every dog has <u>his day</u>"- everyone will have his chance or turn, everyone will get what he deserves
- "*fighting* like <u>cats and dogs</u>"- to argue and fight with someone
- "*gone* to the <u>dogs</u>" to deteriorate, to become bad
- "*the hair* of the dog <u>that bit ya</u>"- a drink of alcohol that one takes when recovering from a hangover
- "to *hound* <u>someone</u>" to pursue or chase someone, to harass someone

- "in the *doghouse*"- in disgrace, disfavor or in trouble, where you go when you've done something wrong
- "to *lead* a dog`s <u>life</u>"- to lead a miserable life
- "let *sleeping* dogs lie" do not make trouble if you don't have to
- "to *put* on the <u>dog</u>" to dress or entertain in a luxurious and extravagant manner
- "it's *raining* <u>cats and dogs</u>"- to rain very hard
- "to *rub* someone's fur" <u>the wrong way</u>"- to irritate someone
- "a *shaggy* dog <u>story</u>"- a long and often pointless story that is told as a joke and often ends in a very silly or unexpected way
- "one's *tail* between <u>one's legs</u>"- feeling beaten or humiliated
- "the *tail* wagging <u>the dog</u>"- a situation where a small part of something controls the whole thing
- "top dog"- the most important person in an organization
- a "*Hot* Dog"- someone who deliberately behaves in such a way as to attract attention
- "to *turn* <u>tail</u>"- to run away from trouble or danger
- "to *work* like <u>a dog</u>"- to work very hard
- "you *can't teach* an old <u>dog new tricks</u>"- the thought that it is difficult for older adults to learn new things
- "like a *dog* with <u>two tails</u>"- A VERY happy dog
- "it's *dog*-<u>eared</u>"- to describe a book or piece of paper that's gotten a bit tatty
